NOTE: Generally, funds are awarded only for capital projects benefitting children and to be completed within one year of the award. Maximum award is \$1,500.00. Capital projects may include items such as program supplies (instruments, books, videos, etc.) but not salaries, rents, mortgages or debt retirements. Matching funds (cash and inkind) are considered in making the awards.
